



The purpose of this fellowship is to experience and gain knowledge about the Revolutionary War and Civil War and the key military leaders who fought in them. In addition, I will visit sites along the way where key events in the Civil Rights Movement occurred. This fellowship will include meeting with expert museum and state park guides, college professors, tour guides, and educators. Tours will include Revolutionary and Civil War battlefields and forts, museums and monuments, state parks, cemeteries, homes of famous military leaders, churches, trails, plantations, and Native American villages. It will also include Civil Rights museums, trails, churches, monuments, and memorials, and walking tours.

Day 1 – Depart Eugene Airport, travel to Augusta, Maine. Arrive in Maine, car rental, hotel

Day 2 – Visit State Capital, [Old Fort Western](#) (Former British Colonial Outpost, built in 1754 during the French and Indian War)

Day 3-4 - Visit [Fort Kent](#), travel to Campobello International Park and [Fort Knox](#) (Meet with park ranger and guide. Boundary between Maine and New Brunswick was a recurring subject of disagreement following the 1783 Treaty of Paris)

Day 5 – Travel to [Machias-Burnham Tavern](#), Site of the First Naval Battle of the American Revolution, travel to [South Solon Meeting House](#) and end at [Appalachian Trail Head](#). (Visit museums)

Day 6 – Spend day at [Sabbath Lake Shaker Village](#). (Guided Tour) Travel to Brunswick.

Day 7 – Brunswick: [Harriet Beecher Stowe House](#) where *Uncle Tom's Cabin* was written. Travel to Portland.

Day 8-9 – Portland: Old Portland Tour, Revolutionary War shipping center, [Wadsworth-Longfellow House](#) (includes teacher lesson plans), [Abyssinian Meeting House](#) (oldest African American Church in Maine and 3rd oldest in the United States)

Day 10-11 Travel to New Hampshire. Portsmouth: [Black Heritage Museum](#) (meet with guide). [Moultonborough Old Country Store](#). [Canterbury Shaker Village](#) (tour guide). [Exeter American Indian Museum](#). Travel to Salem Massachusetts.

Day 12 – Salem Tour. [Old Sturbridge Village](#) (3-hour tour) Travel to Concord: [Minuteman National Historic Park](#) and [Lexington Green](#) with Northbridge to Concord. Minuteman Visitor Center. Travel to Boston.

Day 13-14 – Boston: [Freedom Trail](#) (3 mile guided tour includes 16 historic monuments and attractions including Boston Common, 54 frigate USS Constitution, Charlestown Navy Yard, graves of Paul Revere, John Hancock, and first woman to step off Mayflower, Old State House, birthplace of Benjamin Franklin, Faneuil Hall – the meeting place of revolutionaries, and later, abolitionists, the Paul Revere House and Old North Church (guided tour)

Day 15-16 – Harvard University (3 Museum Tour and tour the oldest known University in the United States founded in 1636). [Norman Rockwell Museum](#).

Day 17-18 – Plymouth: [Pilgrim Hall Museum](#), [National Monument to Forefathers](#), [Burial Hill](#) (includes 2 church tour), Plymouth Rock, [Memorial State Park](#), [Plymouth Grist Mill](#), [Jabez Howland House](#), [Sparrow House](#) and [Mayflower House](#).

Day 19 – Travel to New Haven Connecticut, Tour Yale University and **Natural History Exhibit of Early Native Americans**. Travel to Redding.

Day 20 – Tour [Putnam Memorial Park](#) in Redding (Meet with guides and take many pictures for the [My Brother Sam is Dead](#) Unit). Travel to Gettysburg.

Day 21 – Visit [Gettysburg](#) (watch reenactment, tour museums) Visit [Dobbin House](#) to learn about slavery and the underground railroad, Spend late afternoon and evening in Lancaster learning about Amish. Travel to Philadelphia.

Day 22-24 – Tour [American Philosophical Society](#), the [Museum of American Revolutionaries](#), the [1st and 2nd Bank of the United States](#), visit [Carpenter's Hall](#), [Christ Church](#), [Christ Burial Ground](#), [Betsy Ross House](#), [National Constitution Center: Civil War and Reconstruction Exhibit](#), [African American Museum](#), [Declaration Graff House](#) (where Jefferson wrote the Declaration of Independence). [National Liberty Museum](#). Visit the [Liberty Bell](#), [President's House: Freedom and Slavery](#), [Independence Hall](#) and [Congress Hall](#).

Day 25 – Travel to Baltimore. Visit [Frederick Douglass Museum](#) and driving tour, [Baltimore Civil War Trail](#), [Fort McHenry](#), [Baltimore Civil War Museum](#).

Day 26 – Travel to Annapolis: [State House](#) where the Treaty of Paris was signed.

Day 27 – Travel to Antietam, [Antietam Battlefield](#), [National Museum of Civil War Medicine](#), [Fort Frederick](#) (site of the French and Indian War, Revolutionary War, and Civil War).

Day 28 – Drive along [Booth's Escape Byway](#) including stops at [Surratt House Museum](#), [Dr. Mudd House Museum](#), [St. Mary's Church and Cemetery](#), [Thomas Stone National Historic Site](#) (who signed the Declaration of Independence), visit [Port Tobacco Courthouse](#) (now a Civil War Exhibit)

Day 29 – [Point Lookout State Park](#) and **Civil War Museum** in Scotland MD, Travel to Virginia to visit [Mt. Vernon](#).

Day 30 – [Arlington National Cemetery](#), [Manassas National Park](#), [Monticello](#), [White House of the Confederacy](#).

Day 31-33 – Travel to [Williamsburg](#). Purchase "America's Historic Triangle Pass" (All Colonial Williamsburg sites, [Historic Jamestown](#), [Jamestown Settlement](#), [American Revolution Museum at Yorktown](#), and [Yorktown Battlefield](#) and includes shuttle service)

Day 34 – Travel to North Carolina: [International Civil Rights Museum](#), [Bennet Place](#), to Bentonville. (Meet park guides for tour where Johnston and confederate army surrendered to Sherman and tour last full-scale battlefield in North Carolina)

Day 35 – Travel to South Carolina. Columbia: [Civil War Museum](#), [Fort Sumter](#), [Boone Plantation](#), [Fort Moultrie](#).

Day 36-37 – Travel to Savannah Georgia. Stay in Midtown/Historic District Savannah. [Tour Battlefield Memorial Park](#), [First African Baptist Church](#), [Civil War Monument](#), [Colonial Park Cemetery](#), [American Battlefield Trust: Tour Civil War Savannah](#) in one day (tour guided trip), [Fort McAllister](#), [Fort Pulaski](#), [Fort James Jackson](#), [Green-Meldrim House/Sherman’s Headquarters](#). [A World Apart Monument](#) (Tribute)

Day 38-39 Travel to Montgomery Alabama. Visit the [Civil Rights Memorial](#), [Rosa Parks Museum](#), [Freedom Rides Museum](#), [National Voting Rights Museum](#). Travel to Fort Morgan.

Day 40 – Tour [Fort Morgan](#) (used in War of 1812 and the Civil War). Travel to Selma

Day 41 – Selma – Selma to [Montgomery National Historic Trail](#) including: [Browne Chapel](#), [Edmund Pettus Bridge](#) (Bloody Sunday), [National Memorial for Peace and Justice](#), [MLK Jr. Home](#) and [Church on Dexter Avenue](#). Return to Birmingham and prepare to travel to Oregon.

Day 42 – Depart Birmingham for Eugene, Oregon.
