



Sample Brief Descriptions of Proposed Fellowships

Create a 1-2 sentence description (350 character limit), detailing **What you are doing + Where you are going + Why.** Avoid using personal pronouns, quotation marks or other identifying information.

The following are examples from previously-awarded fellowships:

1. Research in Italy and France the link between history and art to create a unit that results in student documentaries and 2D projects demonstrating the historic and modern relationship between art and fashion.
2. Participate in two SPARK PE Technology Institutes in San Diego, CA, and the National Physical Education and School Sport Institute in Asheville, NC, to create physical education lessons that motivate students and integrate technology.
3. Explore Iceland's geological marvels to enhance earth science instruction with Special Education students through multi-sensory artifacts and primary sources.
4. Explore the British Isles' geography, cultural influences, and historic sites that inspired Byron, Polidori and Stoker's development of vampire legends to increase students' interest in reading.
5. Attend the Teachers College Writing Project at Columbia University in New York City to support the development of a writing curriculum that meets the needs of all students while decreasing the achievement gap for English Language Learners.
6. Explore the Ancient Mayan Civilization while taking classes at the Spanish Language School in Quezaltenago, Guatemala, to build cultural and linguistic proficiencies so the partnership between home and school grows stronger.
7. Trek through Costa Rica, Belize and Guatemala, investigating tropical rain forests, plate tectonics and tropical aquatic diversity, to support environmental science curriculum and improve cultural fluency of an increasing student population at school.
